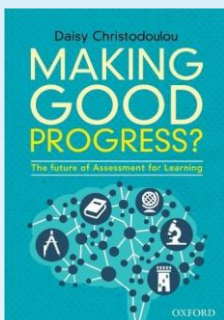
Andy Hargreaves – Highlights from his Keynote Address

Not all collaboration is good – however there is a clear case to collaborate. When teachers work alone they tend to have high levels of individualism and conservatism, this in turn tends to mean teachers focus on the short term and not the long term – putting out fires rather than helping to prevent them in the first place. What do the teachers think are the areas that need improving? Not just what leadership teams think.

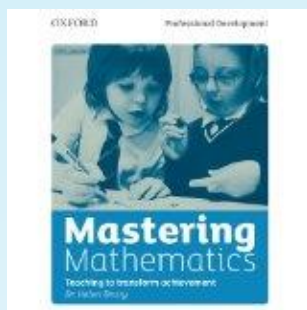
Professional Capital – If you want really good results you need to invest and develop over time.
